2011-2012 SCHOOL PROFILE

SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY:

Deep Run is one of nine high schools in Henrico County with opportunities available at two technical centers. The school is located in the northwest corner of Henrico County and serves about 1600 students in grades 9 through 12. The faculty consists of approximately 110 teachers. Deep Run houses the Center for Information Technology, a specialty center offering hands-on instruction in the application of technology in today's Information Technology field.

ACADEMIC CHARACTERISTICS:

The school year is divided into two semesters. A semester is 18 weeks with two nine-week reporting periods. Seven classes meet every Monday and for 90 minutes on alternating days. The curriculum provides a variety of course offerings which include:

- **Honors:** English 9, 10, 11, and 12, AP English 11, 12; Humanities; Shakespeare Studies; Theatre Arts IV; World History & Geography I & II, Va. & U.S. History, AP Va. & U.S. History, 20th Century Va. & U.S. History, Va. & U.S. Government, AP Va. & U.S. Government, Foundations of Leadership I, II, Our British Heritage, AP European History; AP Psychology; AP Statistics, Geometry, Algebra II, Math Analysis & Trigonometry, AP Calculus AB, AP Calculus BC; Earth Science, Biology, Chemistry, AP Chemistry, Physics, AP Physics B & C, AP Biology, AP Environmental Science; Spanish IV, AP Spanish V; French IV; Latin IV, AP Latin; AP Computer Science A; Advanced Band and Advanced Chorus; Marching Band; Art IV & V, Art History; Intro to Engineering; Specialty Center-Information Technology Courses.
- **A wide variety of offerings** in Computer Science, Business, Family and Consumer Sciences, Technology Education, and Fine Arts
- Twenty-one block programs at the Technical Centers
- **Work Study Programs:** Co-Operative Work Experience for Special Needs Students and Marketing Co-Op

CLASS RANKING:

Class rank and G.P.A. (Grade Point Average) are determined by the levels of courses taken and the grades earned in those courses. Grades earned in courses prior to ninth grade that were awarded a high school credit will not be counted as part of the high school cumulative grade-point average. The initial class ranking is computed at the end of grade 11 by averaging the final averages of grades 9, 10, and 11. The final ranking is computed mid year of the 12th grade and is based on final averages of grades 9, 10, 11 and the first semester averages of grade 12.

Students who are earning either a Standard or an Advanced Studies Diploma are included in class rank. Students earning a Modified Standard Diploma or Special Diploma are excluded from class rank.

Students earning weighted credit will have 0.17 added to their final G.P.A. for each Honors/AP course taken and passed. See the following formula:

$$\text{Cumulative GPA} = \frac{\text{Total Grade Points} + (.17 \times \text{Honors/AP Courses Passed})}{\text{Total Credits Attempted} \times \text{Number of Years}}$$
